The Sheldonian Theatre was opened in 1669, 350 years ago, and the OBC celebrates this anniversary with one of the greatest pieces premiered there, Handel's oratorio *Athalia*. Not only is this the only oratorio conducted by Handel in Oxford, but the Sheldonian is almost certainly the only surviving building where we know he performed any of his oratorios. *Athalia* itself tells the dramatic tale of the downfall of the evil usurper Athalia, Queen of Judah, daughter of Jezebel and worshipper of Baal, with appropriately colourful and exciting music for soloists and chorus alike.

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Welcome to our 2018-19 season...



The **Oxford Bach Choir** has an extraordinary 122-year history and I'm delighted that for my first concerts with the choir, we will be looking back to the OBC's very special relationship with Hubert Parry. Having recently collaborated with the Philharmonia and Gloucester Choral Society for a celebration of Parry's music, we include his choral masterpieces **Songs of Farewell** in a programme of music by composers whose output was significantly affected by the First World War. In 1917, on Parry's last ever visit to Oxford, he heard the OBC give the first performance of *Lord, let me know mine end* ("they sang beautifully", Parry recalled) and just a year later, joining with the Bach Choir, the OBC sang *There is an old belief* at Parry's funeral in St Paul's Cathedral. Some exceptional students from Oxford University will join us as soloists in the Parry concerts and, in another example of our important links with the local community, our ever-popular **Carols for All** will feature singers and instrumentalists from the Oxfordshire County Music Service.

Continuing the theme of composers' 'last works', **Mozart's Requiem** features in March in a concert which includes a rare performance of Bach's great **Trauer-Ode**. Bach's rich orchestration for flutes, oboes, gambas, lutes and strings creates an utterly unique sound-world, and it is a particular pleasure to welcome the UK's longest established chamber orchestra – the London Mozart Players – back to Oxford for this concert.

The season closes with a very special performance of **Handel's Athalia**, labelled by Winton Dean in his classic study of Handel oratorios as 'the first great English oratorio'. The early-music ensemble Florilegium and an outstanding group of soloists, renowned for their ability to project the drama of the music, join with the choir to perform this striking work in the very hall in which the composer once conducted the work.

I hope that you will join us throughout the 2018/19 season and that you will be inspired to come and make music with us at our Come and Sing event **Feel the Spirit!**

Our first concert of the season concludes the Parry festival and marks both the centenary of the Armistice and the death of Hubert Parry, who had a close association with OBC over many years.

We therefore perform Parry's *Songs of Farewell*, composed during the First World War, of which the OBC gave the world premiere as a complete cycle. The concert also includes music reflecting on the war by Stanford, Ireland, Vaughan Williams and Elgar, as well as *The Wind on the Downs* from Jonathan Dove's 2014 cantata *For an Unknown Soldier*, recently recorded by OBC.

The music will be interspersed with readings appropriate to the theme of war and remembrance.

The Oxford Bach Choir sings two much-loved late classics by Mozart: his gentle motet *Ave verum Corpus*, and his great *Requiem*, his last work, left unfinished on his death. The programme also includes JS Bach's *Trauer-Ode*, a magnificent and heartfelt elegy written on the death of a much-loved Saxon queen. The *Trauer-Ode* holds a special secret: Bach reused much of its music, including its imposing and moving opening and closing choruses, for his *St Mark Passion*, which is now lost. We therefore look forward to giving our audience tantalising glimpses of a major lost work by Bach!
